Does my child need help?

The No Stone Unturned TLC provides on-site Autism Diagnostic testing evaluations performed by a trained interdisciplinary team of skilled therapists. The TLC is in partnership with the Center for Child Health and Development at the University of Kansas (KU) Medical Center.

The No Stone Unturned interdisciplinary team of trained therapy professionals uses evaluation assessment tools to gather preliminary information for the KU medical staff. The KU medical staff will review the conclusive report provided by the No Stone Unturned TLC interdisciplinary team prior to a scheduling a telemedicine conference with the family and child.

The second appointment, telemedicine conference with the KU medical team, will be held at the TLC facility. The KU Medical uses telecommunication technology to observe the skills of the child and discuss their findings with the family, saving the family the money, resources and time of traveling to Kansas City.

Based on the reports and their observations they will have a discussion with the family if the child meets the DMS5 criteria for a medical diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder. The KU Medical team will also provide the family with recommendations in regards to the findings.

HOW TO GET STARTED . . .



The TLC was founded to provide support, guidance, information as well as needed training to families, medical staff and educational systems so they can work more collaboratively through the diagnosis, medical interventions and educational processes of children with Autism Spectrum Disorders.

How the Process works:

- To begin, No Stone Unturned TLC will need to receive a referral from a primary care physician.
- The caregiver will then schedule an evaluation for the child by contacting No Stone Unturned TLC
- The family will need to complete a set of paper work prior to the initial appointment
- The NO Stone Unturned TLC team evaluates the child using a specific assessment tool. The family is interviewed to gather more information.
- The No Stone Unturned TLC team compiles a report and send it to the KU Medical staff; a telemedicine appointment date is set.
- The telemedicine appointment is completed. Note: The child must be present for this appointment, as the KU staff will observe and interact with them.
- Following the diagnostic telemedicine appointment a report with findings and recommendations will be sent from the KU Medical staff to parents with the referring doctor.

My husband, Wolf, and I are so excited about our adventure with the No Stone Unturned Foundation. We shared a dream and are blessed to see it to fruition through NSUF. Let me tell you a bit about our inspiration. When our son, Stone, was born, we thought he was perfect. We soon began to have concerns and sought medical intervention. Doctor after doctor, we couldn't find an answer. Every time we would take him to a doctor for one concern, we left that doctor's office with more.

By the time Stone was two he had received OT/PT/Speech/Developmental Services/Chiropractic Services/ Craniosacral therapy and helmet therapy and had seen over 40 specialists. Among those specialists were cardiologists, ophthalmologists, GIs, ENTs, surgeons, dermatologists, allergy specialists, developmental specialists, geneticists, hematologists, and neurologists.

Finally, one of Stone's cardiologists, Dr. Albers, suggested a genetic test. And thus a new journey began. We finally received confirmation of CFC Syndrome. We were devastated. Any hope left that our baby would "grow out of this" was shattered and now we had to live with the reality that his issues were not going away. We grieved. Then something almost magical happened. We began to realize how blessed we really were. We started verbalizing to each other how much our lives had changed because of Stone and how much we had learned throughout this experience. We took a completely new perspective on life.

Stone is a very special little soul. He appreciates everyone and spreads joy as if it is abundant. He is a blessing to us on so many levels and allows us to experience life on a plane that many will never know. We have learned lessons that could not have been possible without him. Yes, Wolf and I know what life really is all about... we have it in our hands and we thank our God for giving us his precious angel for the keeping.

Stone is our Gift. Additionally, we support families that must embark on such an unexpected journey. Because of Stone, our lives are sometimes more painful, but always richer, deeper and more fulfilling than we could have ever imagined.
